Revisiting Entrepreneurship in a Transition Context

This presentation will update a much cited paper published in Small Business Economics in 2001 with the title The Distinctiveness of Entrepreneurship in Transition Economies - not just empirically but also in terms of how transition is treated by entrepreneurship scholars. The paper reviews entrepreneurship in a post-transition context in the light of the understanding of context as described by Welter (2011) and others. The paper emphasises the role of the institutional context (and changes in it) for entrepreneurial behaviour. This leads to a distinction between the paths of institutional change and entrepreneurship in the New Member States of the EU and that taking place in the Former Soviet Republics. The paper can contribute to the field of entrepreneurship by demonstrating firstly, the value of considering entrepreneurship as a societal phenomenon and secondly by emphasising the importance of theories of entrepreneurship being robust enough to accommodate transition conditions. A conclusion is that entrepreneurship in transition would now appear to be less of a minority interest.

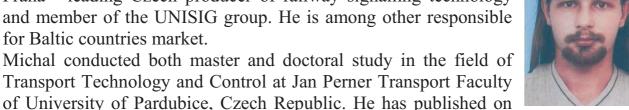
